Have noticed that just recently the Luger Collectors have had a bunch of fast-talking "promoters" who are selling guns; FAKED variations are turning up all over the Country and many of these guys who are faking guns are known to several collectors. However, many collectors are not aware of this situation and are spending a lot of good money for bogus guns; be sure you KNOW the party you are buying the gun(s) from (some of these jokers will write a full 2-page letter to sell one gun). Watch this sort of "flowery-salesmanship"; someone is wanting in your pocketbook. Insist on a MONEY BACK GUARANTEE; if the seller refuses to give one, let him keep the gun; if you have any doubts about the gun being "right", take it to some <u>advanced</u> collector in your area and ask his opinion. (Just hope that this advanced collector is not in "cahoots" with the seller). QUALITY IS LIKE BUYING OATS: IF YOU WANT NICE CLEAN OATS, YOU MUST PAY A FAIR PRICE; HOWEVER, IF YOU CAN BE SATISFIED WITH OATS THAT HAVE ALREADY BEEN THROUGH THE HORSE....THAT COMES A LITTLE CHEAPER. (19). DWM, COMPLETE WITH SEAR AND MAGAZINE SAFETY, page 247, gun is dated 1921 with matching magazine, exc. grips, some parts coloring remaining, police markings on straps, excellent bore. 97% finish on gun.
